CSA Committee Descriptions

Legislative Committee

The CSA Legislative Committee develops strategies and actively work to move the association's legislative issues forward. The CSA Legislative Committee develops legislative advocacy strategies that will protect the Connecticut subcontractor. They provide policy guidance necessary for a strong legislative program

- ◆ During the 2009 session the CSA Legislative Committee was successful in its efforts to pass a bill that will help subcontractors get paid for change orders.
- ◆ In 2010 the CSA Legislative Committee will work to reduce retainage to 5% for UCONN and private work. They will also work to prevent Overhead and Profit from going lower than 15%.



Membership Committee

CSA recognizes that the most effective marketing tool for membership growth is a peer to peer recruitment and retention program led by volunteer members.

The CSA Membership Committee develops strategic plans and sets recruitment and retention goals each year.

The CSA Membership Committee is continually working to grow the association and provide more benefits and services including:

- ◆ A a lower membership fee structure for small subcontractors: (\$500 instead of \$950.)
- ◆ A Staples office supply saving program;
- ◆ A new Member-Get-A-Member Campaign. Today, if you recruit a new member you could attend four meetings for free. That's a potential savings of \$240!

Program Committee

CSA conducts quarterly educational forums that cover a wide variety of issues of importance and concern to the subcontractor.

The Program Committee analyzes the membership's educational needs and makes recommendations for seminars and meetings to meet those specific needs.

They arranges for speakers and the distribution and publication of literature at workshops, in the CSA newsletter, and on the association's website.

In 2010 the programs will include a legislative session, a seminar to cover Department of Public Works issues, a forum with a general contractor and workshops on lien laws and workers compensation.



Website Committee

The CSA website represents the association, its priorities and mission. The website is designed to keep members up to date on legislative issues and programs.

The website should enhance CSA membership and be used by members to register for programs, learn about legislative and regulatory issues of concern and to obtain information that will help with their own business development.

The website should also be used as a membership recruitment tool and it should be a showcase for membership benefits and services.

The Website Committee identifies areas that will improve the design and function of the website and ensures that content of the website meets the association's objectives.
